2017 Budget Narrative

For the 2017 budget, the Carver County Community Development Agency (CDA) is requesting a levy of \$2,297,989 which has a \$1.34 increase on a home with the Estimated Market Value of \$303,400.

Rental Housing Programs

The CDA administers a variety of housing programs in Carver County that assist households with various affordable housing options. The following is a summary of the major rental programs:

Veterans - The CDA was awarded three project based vouchers from Metro HRA for homeless veterans. We have a ten year contract with Metro HRA for the units. Residents will pay 30% of their adjusted monthly income towards rent.

Public Housing - The CDA owns and operates a Federally subsidized Public Housing Rental Program that consists of 81 units scattered thru-out the county that range from apartment style units to single family homes. This program is for households at or below 80% of Area Median Income (\$45,100 for 1 person).

Rental Assistance - The CDA administers a variety of smaller rental assistance programs with funding provided through a variety of agencies that include HUD, the State of MN and Minnesota Housing. These programs are offered in collaboration with the First Street Center/Mental Health Department and The Carver-Scott Educational Cooperative's New Beginnings Program.

Additionally, the CDA was awarded a total of nine (9) Project-Based Vouchers for three (3) properties through the Metro HRA. Three of the units, one at each property, is designated for homeless.

Section 811 – The CDA was awarded Section 811 funding in 2015 for five units. Section 811 provides project-based rental assistance for low-income people with disabilities.

Housing - The CDA owns four rental developments within the county that consist of affordable, work force housing; 225 units that range from efficiency type units to three-bedroom townhomes.

Senior Housing - The CDA also owns over 297 units of 55+ housing for seniors looking to down size into a more manageable housing unit in a senior, socially active community.

Housing Counseling – Rental counseling, pre-purchase counseling, foreclosure counseling and post-purchase counseling are services offered to Carver County residents seeking assistance with their housing needs. The CDA is also a part of the Minnesota Homeownership network in order to stay connected with the ever changing landscape of housing counseling.

Coordinated Entry – The CDA became an access point for the Coordinated Entry System in August 2015 for single adults and families that experiencing homelessness. We act as a conduit

to the Coordinated Entry System, which is HUD mandated to connect the homeless with housing program resources.

CDA Economic and Community Development Programs

The CDA oversees a variety of Federal and State programs including the Small Cities Development Program, the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency Programs, Livable Communities Demonstration Account Program grants through the Metropolitan Council and other grants that are awarded to the CDA at various times.

The CDA has a partnership with the Carver County Department of Public Health and Environmental Services Departments to process applications, administer low interest loan funds, and apply special assessments to properties for homeowners that replace Individual Sewage Treatment Systems (ISTS) throughout Carver County.

The Community Growth Partner Initiatives Grant Program was created and funded by the Carver County Community Development Agency (CDA) in January of 2016. The goals of the Program are to increase the tax base and improve the quality of life in Carver County through three specific strategies: affordable housing development, job creation and redevelopment.

The CDA actively looks for properties and development sites in the County to develop new senior and affordable workforce rental housing to meet the housing demand outlined in the Carver County 2030 Comprehensive Plan.

2015 Major Accomplishments & Challenges

The CDA administers the Minnesota City Participation Program (MCPP) offered through the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency. The MCPP program is designed to assist first time homebuyers in Carver County obtain affordable financing to purchase a home. The 2016 MCPP program year has been a resounding success to date.

A Regular Session of the Carver County Board of Commissioners was held in the County Government Center, Chaska, on August 2, 2016. Chair James Ische convened the session at 9:03 a.m.

Members present: James Ische, Chair, Gayle Degler, Vice Chair, Tim Lynch, Randy Maluchnik and Tom Workman.

Members absent: None.

Degler moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Maluchnik moved, Lynch seconded, to approve the minutes of the July 19, 2016, Regular Session. Degler, Ische, Lynch, Maluchnik voted aye. Workman abstained as he did not attend the meeting. Motion carried.

Community announcements were made by the Board.

Degler moved, Workman seconded, to approve the following consent agenda items:

Approved out of state travel for Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator to attend the Upper Midwest Invasive Species Conference.

Authorized the Chair to sign the stormwater retrofit cost share professional services agreement with the City of Chaska pending contract review and related budget amendment.

Approved professional services agreement with SRF Consulting Group, Inc., for \$217,760 to assist with transportation planning for the 2040 Carver County Comprehensive Plan pending finalization of the contract review process.

Motion carried unanimously.

Sam Pertz, Parks, requested the Board authorize a log rolling recreation activity at the Carver County Fair. He noted the previously held work session with the Board to discuss recreational activities Parks would offer. He stated they continue to coordinate with Risk Management, have a well orientated staff and have constant communication with the Parks Commission. Pertz explained they have coordinated a proper site with the Fair Board and log rolling would be offered free to participants. He stated they wanted to make people aware of all the activities Parks offer and they have tried to mitigate risks.

Lynch moved, Maluchnik seconded, to approve and authorize Park staff to provide log rolling services at the 2016 Carver County Fair. Motion carried unanimously.

Nick Koktavy, Public Services, requested the Board approve the Chaska License Center drive through project. He reviewed a sketch of the project and the scope of the work to be completed.

He stated two quotes were received and identified the proposed \$90,000 budget for the work. Koktavy added they anticipated completion in October.

Maluchnik moved, Degler seconded, to contract with Graystone Construction for the Chaska License Center Drive through project, pending completion of the contract review process. Motion carried unanimously.

Lynch moved, Degler seconded, to adjourn the Regular Session at 9:26 a.m. and go into a work session to review the Hollywood Township sale shed location and improvements and to review 2017 budget FTE requests. Motion carried unanimously.

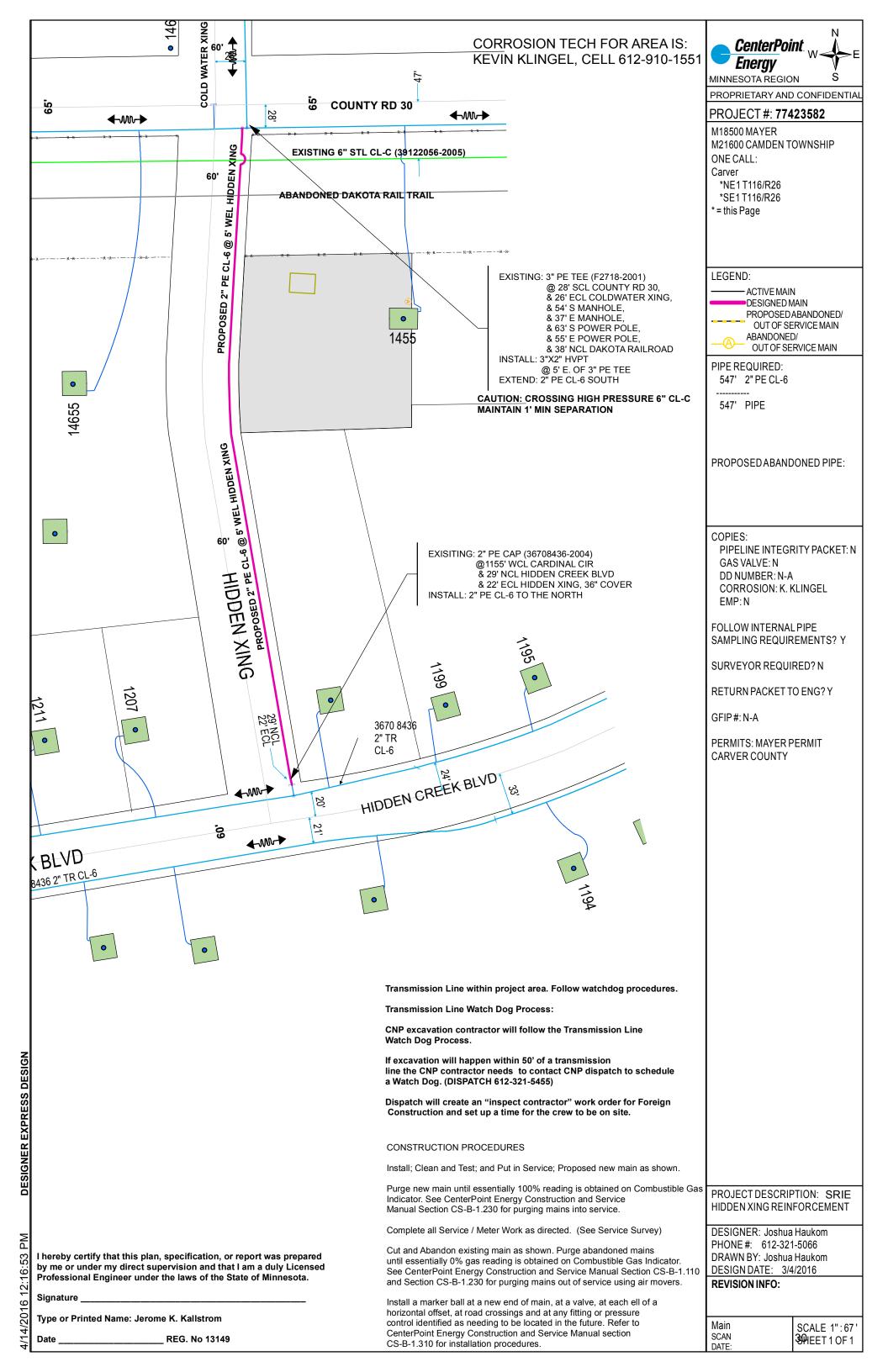

WHEREAS, said application was duly considered at a public hearing held by the Carver County Planning Commission at its regular meetings of June 21, 2016, and July 19, 2016; and,

WHEREAS, the Carver County Planning Commission finds as follows:

- 1. The subject property (28.42 acres) is owned by MaryAnn Porter and is located in the Southwest Quarter of Section 8, Waconia Township. The proposed request is located on Outlot B of Rutz Lake Shores Plat, on approximately 15 acres of the 28 acre parcel, which consists of agricultural production land, wetlands, and wooded areas. It is located in the Agricultural Zoning District, a portion in the Shoreland Overlay District, and the CCWMO (Carver Creek & Crow River watersheds)
- 2. The Planning Commission continued the public hearing from the June 21, 2016 meeting to the July 19, 2016 meeting to allow for additional review and discussion regarding, but not limited to, stray voltage mitigation, landscaping details, decommissioning, and drainage and maintenance plans. A "60-Day Law" letter was sent to the applicant on July 6, 2016, extending the deadline for a final decision until September 23, 2016.
- 3. The applicant, GreenMark Solar (developer) in partnership with Clean Focus Renewables (capital provider), is requesting to construct, operate (by lease), and maintain up to a three megawatt (3MW) Community Solar Garden (CSG) as a Renewable Energy Large Solar Energy System (SES) Conditional Use Permit (CUP) on the subject parcel. The request is being proposed as part of Xcel Energy's Community Solar Garden program, which was established after the passage of the Minnesota State solar energy legislation in 2013 requiring individually owned utilities to get 1.5% of their electricity from solar by 2020. The energy contract with Xcel Energy for this program is for a minimum of 25 years. The proposed request is considered a Large Solar Energy System (SES) based on the fact that the current (DC) rate capacity exceeds 100 kilowatts and would produce energy which would be added to Xcel Energy's existing grid system. Therefore, a CUP is required pursuant to Section 152.039 and 152.052 of the Zoning Code.
- 4. The applicant is proposing to construct and operate up to three (3) co-located one (1) MW solar gardens. As a whole, the 3MW project would require 10,800 solar panels in rows separated by 19 feet. The panels proposed for the site would be tilted at a 30 degree angle and may extend to 15 feet in height. The panels would feed through inverters and ultimately connect to the electric grid at a point of interconnection at a location at the south of the parcel. The applicant has not provided information regarding the interconnection design and appearance, which would likely involve numerous large utility poles. The transformers and related equipment would be placed on (3) concrete pads at each 1MW section of the CSG. Xcel Energy's interconnection agreement requires that equipment updates be completed, including installation of remote monitoring and other substation updates, installation of metering equipment, and replacement of approximately 7, 900 feet of conductor line. The applicant has indicated that the existing line is "3 phase," which does not appear to be

- correct and therefore would generate additional project impacts. Also, the exact panel array, inverters, and electrical interconnection configuration and dimensions may change based on the actual equipment and manufacturer selection.
- 5. The applicant has indicated that the site determination was based on solar resource, physical characteristics, proximity to Xcel Energy infrastructure, applicable zoning and permitting requirements, and land owner participation. The surrounding properties and land uses include residential homes, lakeshore lots, farming operations, animal agriculture, and agricultural production land. Based on the testimony received, the siting process has not been adequately addressed.
- 6. The applicant has proposed a 6 foot slatted chain-link fence surrounding the perimeter of the operational area. The applicant has also provided screening information. However, testimony was received that the applicant's illustrations of the southerly portion of the property are inaccurate; specifically, the interconnection infrastructure appears to be missing.
- 7. Main access to the site has been proposed off of 78th Street, to the south. The Waconia Town Board, as the road authority, does not support construction of an access off of the township road.
- 8. The applicant has indicated that during construction there may be an average of one semi-trailer trip per day and temporary directional signs may be posted as well as temporary parking on site. According to the applicant, once completed, the facility would operate twenty four hours per day, 365 days a year and monitored remotely. Crews would be sent to the site to conduct routine maintenance on equipment and to maintain vegetation.
- 9. The applicant would need to comply with the Carver County Planning and Water Management Department (CCWMO) and Carver Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) standards with respect to the County Water Rules (Chapter 153), and for site stabilization requirements and Best Management Practices (BMP's). The Carver County Water management Organization (CCWMO) would require compliance with and/all applicable permitting requirements.
- 10. According to testimony received at the June 21 and July 19, 2016 meetings, the neighborhood is an area of intensive animal agriculture operations, and neighbors are concerned about the inadequacy of stray voltage monitoring.
- 11. The neighboring property owners have provided public testimony at the Planning Commission meetings urging the Planning Commission to deny the conditional use due to the incompatibility of the proposed use with the neighborhood, history of poor drainage on the parcel, potential for increased drainage issues, and impact on the agricultural and residential community, including property values. An attorney, representing neighboring property owners, also testified that the applicant did not adequately address required findings pursuant to Section 152.251 for the issuance of a CUP.
- 12. Testimony during the June 21, 2016, and July 19, 2016, Planning Commission meetings was received from the general public and neighboring property owners regarding their concerns about the potential for negative impacts on the Township road, drainage impacts, inadequate screening, minimal illustration on site plans to provide interconnection details, and incompatibility with the existing residential neighborhood (9 existing homes and 2 residential lots in the immediate area).
- 13. The Waconia Town Board reviewed the request during their April 11, 2016, Town Board meeting and provided a written "No recommendation, but will comment on the request at the Planning Commission or Board of Adjustment hearing." (dated: April 11, 2016). A Waconia Town Board Supervisor, speaking on behalf of the Town Board, recommended denial at the June 21, 2016 Planning Commission meeting. At the July 19, 2016 Planning Commission meeting, the Waconia Town Board Chairman recommended denial of the CUP (Renewable Energy Solar Site) based on the written and public testimony from the Waconia Township citizens and neighboring residents. The Town Board opposes this request and recommends denial for the following reasons:
 - A. Incompatibility with the neighborhood.
 - B. Impact on approximately 1.25 miles of unpaved local Township roads in each direction.
 - C. Neighborhood concerns regarding minimal screening and visual impact of the solar array.

- 14. Pursuant to Section 152.251 REQUIRED FINDINGS of the Carver County Zoning Code, an order for the issuance of a CUP or IUP can be adopted only if all ten (10) Findings of Fact (A-J) can be found as fact. Any conditions imposed by the permit or actions required as part of the order shall be considered in making findings. The request does not meet the required Findings of Fact pursuant to Section 152.251 (B)(E)(I) as follows:
 - (B) The conditional or interim use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
 - 1. Based on public testimony, the request may be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for purposes already permitted including animal agriculture, and residential homes and farms.
 - (E) The adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other facilities have been or are being provided.
 - 1. Based on testimony received from the Waconia Township Chair, access off of the proposed Township road, 78th Street, has not been approved and is not supported by the road authority.
 - 2. Based on public testimony, proposed drainage and stormwater management may not provide sufficient mitigation for the already saturated site.
 - (I) The use or development is compatible with the land uses in the neighborhood.
 - 1. Based on a submitted land value report conducted by Cal Haskins (dated: July 19, 2016) during the public hearing process, the proposed use may have a negative impact on neighboring property values and be incompatible with the neighborhood.
 - 2. The proposed use would not be compatible with the existing character of the neighborhood (there are 9 existing homes and the possibility of additional homes in the immediate area) with multiple century farms. Additionally, the applicant has not provided information regarding the interconnection design and appearance that would likely involve numerous large, unscreened, utility poles within the operational area, which would be a significant change in the neighborhood.
 - 3. Based on public testimony and a signed petition received from neighboring property owners, at the June 21, 2016 Planning Commission meeting, the proposed use would take away from the rural and natural surrounding environment of the neighborhood.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT The Carver County Planning Commission hereby recommends <u>denial</u> of the subject permit for a Large Solar Energy System (SES) - Conditional Use Permit on the land described in Exhibit "A" of the permit application.

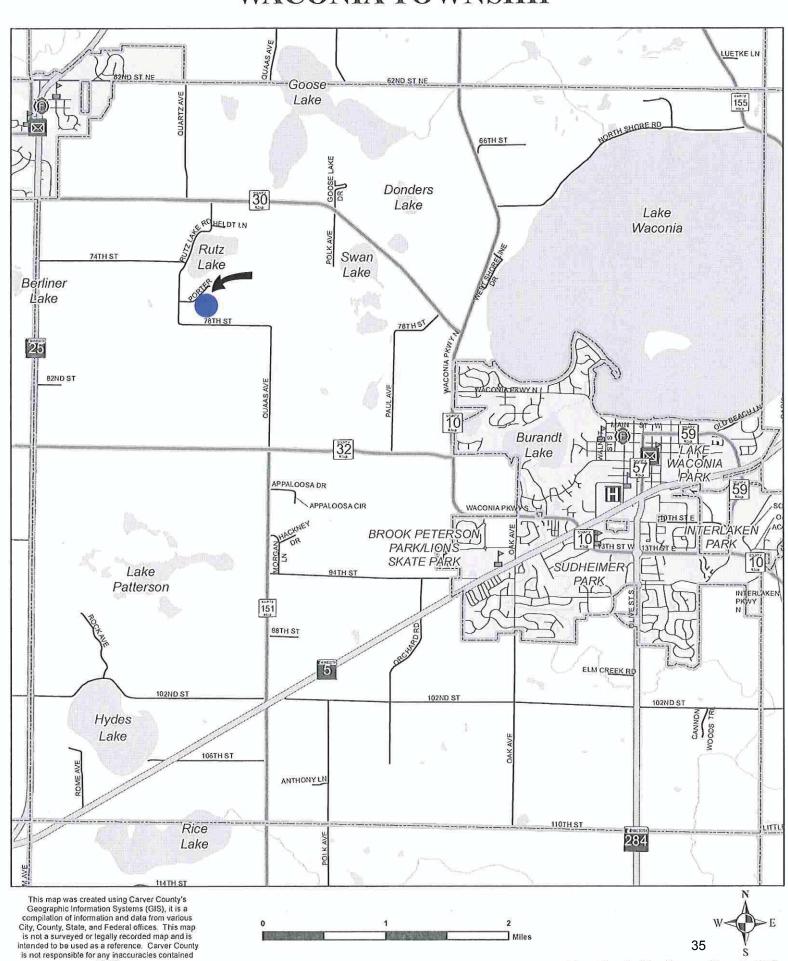
